

## **Regulations for Subsidizing Students Participating in International Activities**

Article 1 These regulations have been stipulated to encourage student to broaden their horizons and improve transnational mobility through participating in international activities.

Article 2 “International activities” refers to academic conference, short-term research, exchange abroad, internship abroad, international competition and oversea short-term curriculum.

Article 3 Only registered students of the College of Liberal Art are eligible for application.

Article 4 Applicants could apply for other sources of subsidy in advance. There will be no repetitive subsidization in principle.

Article 5 Applicants should present the following documents within the application period:

1. Application form of Participating in International Activities.
2. Acceptance letter or other certified documents.
3. Abstract of research paper. Or else, research or learning proposal.
4. A description of the application submitted to other subsidizers, or a copy of the subsidy result notification letter.

5. Alternative supporting documents, e.g. Full-text of research paper, relevant publications or proof of foreign language proficiency.

The dean will invite relevant teachers in reviewing once upon acceptance.

- Article 6 At most one application will be accepted per person yearly. The funding ceiling for subsidies shall be determined by the Administrative Management Committee in accordance with the "Standard Upper Limit Table for Subsidy Funds of the College of Liberal Arts." The actual reimbursement is under the regulations issued by NCCU Budget, Accounting and Statistic Office.
- Article 7 This subsidy prioritizes activities such as "full paper presentations at international academic conferences," "exchange student programs," "overseas internships," and "participation in international competitions." Other activities may be granted subsidies at the discretion of the committee.
- Article 8 Recipients should submit an e-version of Report on Going Abroad for reference.
- Article 9 Any matters that are not addressed in these admission regulations shall be governed by other related NCCU policies.
- Article 10 These guidelines were passed during the Administration Meeting of the College. The same shall apply to all subsequent amendments.
